AIMEE L. wanted to serve those in recovery by becoming a Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor (CADC). Completing this type of certification would increase her job prospects, but she needed to find a way to achieve her career goals while keeping herself financially afloat during the COVID-19 pandemic.
